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Our Tantalising Thailand birding tour covers the main birding sites of this fascinating country with its diverse birdlife including beautiful and rare specialties. The birdlife ranges from huge hornbills to tiny flowerpeckers, supplemented by an influx of migrants from northern Asia. Thailand has a superb network of reserves containing representative examples of every major habitat from lowland rainforest to montane evergreen forest and high altitude, moss-encrusted rhododendron thickets. Our tour through this exotic, vibrant and beautiful country with its diverse ethnic groups, age-old monarchy and rich cultural heritage has great appeal and will no doubt delight and surprise you. We will look for a host of localised species including Siamese Fireback, Great Hornbill,

Banded Kingfisher, Silver-breasted Broadbill, Coral-billed Ground Cuckoo, Blue and Eared Pitta, White-rumped Falcon, Black-headed Woodpecker, Grey Peacock-Pheasant, Green Cochoa, Spotbreasted Parrotbill, Red-faced Liocichla, Giant Nuthatch and Green Peafowl just to name a few. We also visit the southern end of the peninsula that connects to Malaysia. Here we explore the mangrove forest near Krabi, with its Mangrove Brown-winged Kingfisher and Ruddy Kingfisher, while inland, the remnant patches of lowland forest hold some of Thailand's rarest birds, with Red-crowned Barbet, Fulvous-chested Jungle Flycatcher, Great Iora, Scarlet-rumped Trogon, Malayan Banded Pitta, Green Broadbill, Chestnut-naped Forktail, Great Argus and more!

#### **Tour details**

**Thailand tour starts:** Please arrive in Bangkok on or before 1 March 2022. You will be transferred to our hotel for dinner & introductions.

**Thailand tour finishes:** Please depart from Phuket on or after 19 March 2022. Our hotel is right on the beach and you might like to stay on for an extra day or two to relax. See daily itinerary for further details.

Leader: David Kowalick and local guide plus dedicated driver.

**Difficulty:** Low/Medium/High/Excellent level of fitness required. The tour has a relaxed pace and walks are on surfaces varying from flat to undulating, but may include some short climbs. We generally walk slowly, with lots of stops. You can opt out of any challenging walks.

**What to bring:** Please travel light. Binoculars, camera, mobile phone, chargers, power adaptors (European style), strong insect repellent, sunscreen, personal medications, travel umbrella, hat, water bottle, hand sanitizer. Sturdy footwear recommended. Scopes, super-telephoto lenses with tripods, and heavy suitcases are discouraged.

**Accommodation:** Private ensuite rooms in hotels or lodges, air-conditioned where necessary. Standards are good and comfortable. Wi-fi is widely available and free, but not available on some nights.

**Clothing:** Lightweight long pants, t-shirt and long-sleeved shirt, over the top of which you can wear layers that can be taken off as necessary, including a rain-proof jacket. Bright colours not advised. Neat casual attire for dinners. Shorts and sandals or thongs (flip-flops) are acceptable for non-birding time.

**Group size:** Minimum 4, maximum 8 participants.

**Cost:** AU\$8,999 per person, single supplement AU\$1100. Cost includes all accommodation, all meals, guiding, transport, entry fees and more. Cost is based on double or twin-share occupancy. Not included: drinks, tips, personal expenses. Scalable return-client discount applies (see website for details). *Tour price will change with currency fluctuations* >5% (up or down!)



### **ITINERARY**

Day 0: Arrive (01 Mar) Fly to Bangkok International Airport (own arrangements), where you will be transferred to your hotel (transfer and hotel included in price) to rest and refresh. Should you decide to travel earlier, please make your own way to our hotel. We will meet for introduction, dinner and orientation. Overnight: Bangkok hotel (ensuite hotel room; meals included: D).

Day 1: Bangkok-Pak Thale/Phetchaburi Province (02 Mar) After an early breakfast we head straight to Pak Thale, the world-famous shorebird site where Spoonbilled Sandpiper is still a regular annual visitor. The area consists of coastal mud flats, mangroves, shrimp farms and freshwater lagoons. We'll take a boat ride out into the mangroves looking for Nordmann's Greenshank, White-faced Plover, Chinese Egret, Malaysian Plover, Sanderling and Pallas's Gull in full breeding plumage. The nearby Kings Project area, which has a mix of mangroves and settling pools, could net us Pintailed Snipe, Common Snipe, Greater Painted Snipe, Long-toed Stint, Temminck's Stint, Little Ringed Plover, Ruff, Spotted Redshank and Indian Nightjar. Other possible birds today include Brown- headed Gull, Indian Pond Heron, Black-tailed Gull, Pallas's Gull, Heuglin's Gull, Milky Stork, Spot-billed Pelican, Broad-billed Sandpiper, Dunlin, Rednecked Phalarope, Spoon-billed Sandpiper, Far Eastern and Eurasian Curlew, Pied Avocet, Spotted Redshank just to mention a few! After lunch we travel to Kaeng Krachan. Due to its location at the meeting point of two biogeographical areas and its range of altitudes Kaeng Krachan is host to more birds than any other park in Thailand. We will see Large Scimitar Babbler, Bamboo Woodpecker, Greater Yellownape, Rubycheeked Sunbird, Great Slaty Woodpecker, Blue-bearded Bee-eater. We will also spend time near the River to explore Blue Pitta, Green Magpie, Black-backed Kingfisher, Black and Yellow Broadbill, Silver-breasted Broadbill, Dusky Broadbill and Banded Broadbill. Mammals include Dusky Langur, White-handed Gibbon, Black Giant Squirrel, Variable Squirrel and many others. Overnight: Baan Maka Nature Lodge (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B,L,D)

Day 2: Kaeng Krachan National Park/Phetchaburi Province (03 Mar) We'll spend the entire day in the fascinating Kaeng Krachan National Park. After early morning breakfast we head to Baan Krang Camp. A road runs 35km through the park and most of the birding is done along it. There are also a couple of trails in the river section outside the park with a few permanent hides which are excellent for bird photography. We'll be looking for birds such as Bar-backed Partridge, Black-naped Monarch, Common Green Magpie, Kalij Pheasant, Large Scimitar Babbler, Green-legged Partridge, Red-legged Crake, Eared Pitta, Racket-tailed Treepie, Black-and-red Broadbill, Golden-crested Myna, Great Hornbill, Great Slaty Woodpecker, Dusky Broadbill, Green Cochoa, Ferruginous Partridge, Orange-breasted Trogon, Silver-breasted Broadbill, White-fronted Scops Owl, Tickell's Brown Hornbill, Long-tailed Broadbill, Von Schrenck's Bittern, Ratchet-tailed Treepie, Mountain Hawk-Eagle, Blue-throated Barbet, Black-throated Laughingthrush, Rufous-browed Flycatcher, Green-Legged Partridge, Pin-

tailed Parrotfinch, Red-bearded Bee-eater, while possible mammals include Golden Jackal and Asian Elephant. Overnight: **Baan Maka Nature Lodge** (en-suite hotel room, meals included: B, L, D).

Day 3: Kaeng Krachan National Park/Phetchaburi Province (04 Mar) Early morning drive up to Phanern Thung Summit. Here we target Ratchet-tailed Treepie, White-hooded Babbler, White-browed Shrike-Babbler, Orange-bellied Leafbird, Streaked Spiderhunter, Mountain Imperial Pigeon. After lunch at Park's Restaurant, we head to KM.27 to see Speckled Piculet, Blue-throated Barbet, Longtailed Broadbill, Red-bearded Bee eater, Ratchet-tailed Treepie, Yellow-bellied Warbler, and many others. Overnight: Baan Maka Nature Lodge (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 4: Kaeng Krachan NP to Khao Yai NP (05 Mar) Early morning bird watching at Uncle Sin Bird's Pool. We look for Greater Necklaced Laughingthrush, Lesser Necklaced Laughingthrush, Common Green Magpie, Black-naped Mornarch, Black-crested Bulbul, Black-headed Bulbul and many the other birds. We will encounter mammals such as Lesser Mouse Deer, Red Munjack, Black-tailed Squirrel, Variable Squirrel, Burmese striped squirrel. After lunch, transfer to Khao Yai NP with bird watching on the way. Overnight: Golden Gold Resort (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 5: Khao Yai NP/Nakhon Ratchasima Province (06 Mar) We spend a full day in Khao Yai where seasonal evergreen forest is mixed with expanses of grassland. An extensive system of trails means that there is plenty of opportunity to explore the forest and look for wildlife. Khao Yai is one of the best places in South-East Asia to see Asian Elephant and with this extensive area of habitat many species of birds can be found too. Great, Oriental Pied and Wreathed Hornbills are easily seen and both Silver and Siamese Fireback Pheasants can be found here. The fabulous Blue Pitta is regularly seen, although it is difficult, and Eared Pitta is even more difficult. Many other amazing birds may be seen during our visit; Long-tailed Broadbill, Slatybacked Forktail, Orange-breasted and Red-headed Trogons; while Nightjars frequent open areas at dusk and dawn. Mammals are present in good numbers: Sambar deer and Muntjac in the fields and Pig-tailed Macaques on the road. One of the most enigmatic mammals is the noisy White-handed Gibbon, while Dhole, Variable Squirrel and Malayan Sun Bear may be seen. Around the Khao Kieaw Summit, where we will target Silver Pheasant, Red-headed Trogon, Moustached Barbet, Ashy Bulbul just to name a few mouthwatering species! At Pha Klouy Mai, we'll look for Moustached, Green-eared Barbet, Coppersmith Barbet, Blue-eared Barbet, Asian Paradise Flycatcher, Grey-headed Flycatcher, and many others. Evening of Day 5 we enjoy a Night Safari with a ranger. Overnight: Golden Gold Resort (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 6: Khao Yai NP / Nakhon Ratchasima Province (07 Mar) An early breakfast sees us birding at Tha Ngoi Lake for Yellow-eye Babbler, Chestnut-capped Babbler, Long-tailed Shrike, Rain Quail, Small Buttonquail, Barred Buttonquail, Little

Green Bee-eater, Lesser Coucal, Asian Barred Owlet, Spotted Owlet and many the other Birds. We shall then return to our resort, check out and head to Pra Phutthabath Temple for endemic species Rufous Limestone Wren Babbler. After lunch we transfer to Bueng Boraphet. Overnight: **Mhai Hom Resort** (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 7: Bueng Boraphet Freshwater Lake (08 Mar) Bueng Boraphet is the largest freshwater swamp and lake in central Thailand. Originally it was covered by a large swamp, which was flooded in 1930 with the building of a dam to improve fishing. Today it is one of the best waterbird sites in South East Asia. Here we start our birding by Long-tail Boat. This allows us close up views and ample opportunity for photography as well. Birds we can expect to see include Lesser Whistling-Duck, Garganey, Ferruginous Duck, Eurasian Moorhen, Grey-headed Swamphen, Redwattled Lapwing, Kentish Plover, Little Ringed Plover, Pheasant-tailed and Bronzewinged Jacana, Asian Openbill, Oriental Darter, Little and Indian Cormorant, Herons, Egrets and with some luck Black-headed Ibis. Also, an array of Kingfisher including Common, White-throated Kingfisher and Black-capped Kingfisher, Indian Roller, Black-browed and Oriental Reed Warbler, Striated Grassbird. After the afternoon birding, we shall transfer to Mea Wong NP. Overnight: Rattana Bordee Resort (ensuite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

### Days 8-9: Mea Wong National Park/Kampeangphet Province (09-

10 Mar) Mae Wong is one of the western-most parks in Thailand. It is home to a few very rare species like Burmese Yuhina and Coral-billed Scimitar-Babbler. We spend two full days here, exploring the park from the headquarters in an area of bamboo at the base of the mountain, to the many trails traversing the forests at various altitudes. We'll be looking for birds such as Blue Pitta, Grey Peacock-Pheasant, Rustynaped Pitta, White- crowned Forktail, Rufous-throated Partridge, Asian Stubtail, Golden-throated Barbet, Long-tailed Sibia, Great Barbet, Spot-necked Babbler, Olive Bulbul, White-throated Bulbul and Olive Bulbul, Red-billed Blue Magpie, Burmese Yuhina, Coral-billed Scimitar-Babbler, Red-billed Scimitar-Babbler, Eyebrowed Wren-Babbler, Sulphur-breasted Warbler, White-bellied Erpornis, Silver-eared Mesia, Chestnut-flanked White-eye. In the afternoon of Day 9 we transfer to Chiang Doa. Overnight: Sakulchai Place (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Days 10-11: Doi Lang National Park (11-12 Mar) We'll spend two full days in well-known Doi Lang National Park. One of the largest parks in Thailand's north, the park covers 1170 square kilometers and is dominated by two north-south mountain ranges, elevations range from 600 m to 1798 m at the peak of Doi Lang. During Feb — Mar temperatures range between 27 to 32C. The fertile forests are made up of hill evergreen forest, moist evergreen forest, mixed deciduous forest and dry dipterocarp forest. The park protects a variety of habitats and has been known as a good birding spot for many years but now it's even better thanks to the improved access road and hides the local birders have put up to photograph the birds. Now Doi Lang offers some of the best bird watching and photography in Thailand. These 2 days we'll be birding different parts of the 30km road up the mountain. Birds include Blue Whistling-thrush,











White-headed Bulbul, White-capped Redstart, Dark-backed Sibia, Blue Pitta, Grey Peacock-pheasant



Chestnut-headed Tesia, Golden Bush-Robin, White-bellied Redstart, Himalayan Bluetail, Rufous-gorgeted flycatcher, Rusty-naped Pitta, Scarlet-faced Liocichla, Spectacled Barwing, Spot-throated Babbler, Ultramarine Flycatcher, White-gorgeted Flycatcher, Spot-breasted Parrotbill, Mountain Bamboo Partridge, Lesser Shortwing, Crested Finchbill, Black-throated Tit, Rufous-throated Partridge, Large Niltava, Hume's Pheasant, Small Niltava, Giant Nuthatch, and many others. Overnight: Tangerine Vine Hotel (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 12: Doi Inthanon National Park (13 Mar) Doi Inthanon has long been considered the jewel of north Thailand's birding locations. At 2,565 metres it is the highest mountain in Thailand and the source of many rivers. The National Park has beautiful natural scenery and waterfalls, while the forests in the park include Moist Evergreen Forest, Pine forest and Mixed Deciduous Forest. There are many beautiful flowers including orchids, phycastylis and rhododendron. Sphagnum Moss and osmanda fern are found at higher levels in the park. Because of its broad altitudinal range and the cool climate of its upper reaches, the park supports the largest number of bird species of any site in Thailand. Species restricted to Doi Inthanon are Ashythroated Warbler and an endemic race of the Green-tailed Sunbird; the park is the only site where Chestnut-bellied Rock-Thrush and Yellow-bellied Flowerpecker are known to occur. Our visit will cover a variety of habitats to maximize the bird numbers and we'll be looking for, amongst others: Black-backed Sibia, Rufous-throated Partridge, Pygmy Wren-Babbler, Snowy-browed Flycatcher, White-browed Shortwing, Pygmy Wren Babbler, Blyth's Leaf Warbler, Ashy-throated Warbler, Grey Bush Chat, Hill Prinia, Mountain Bulbul, Ashy Wood Pigeon, Speckled Wood Pigeon, Green-tailed Sunbird, Mrs Gould's Sunbird, Rufous-winged Fulvetta, Silver-eared Laughingthrush, Yunnan Fulvetta, Chestnut-crowned Warbler, Large Niltava, Greychinned Minivet, Slaty-breasted Tesia, Green Cochoa, Hume's Treecreeper' Streaked Spiderhunter' Grey-breasted Parrotbill, Grey-throated Babbler, Spectacled Barwing, Crested Goshawk, Collared Falconet, Black-backed Forktail, Plumbeous Water Redstart, Slaty-backed Flycatcher, Stripe-breasted Woodpecker. We will explore the jeep trails, for example at KM 33 to search for Black-throated Parrotbill, Long-tailed Shrike, Rufous-bellied Niltava, Large Hawk Cuckoo.

We visit Siri Phum Waterfall, where we look for White-capped water Redstart, Plumbeous Redstart, Black-tailed Crake. We also journey to other destinations within and around the National Park. Overnight: **Mr. Deang Birding Center** (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 13: Doi Inthanon National Park (14 Mar) Today's adventure commences at KM.34.5 to explore Large Niltava, Small Niltava, Streak-breasted Woodpecker, Chestnut-fronted Shrike-Babbler, White-browned Shrike-Babbler, Rufous-backed Sibia, and many other birds. At Mea Klang Luang Village we look for Black-backed and Slaty-backed Forktail, Blue-throated Flycatcher, White Wagtail, Citrine Wagtail, Oriental Turtle Dove and many other birds. Around mid-day we head to Chiang Mai to

arrive in time for our afternoon flight to Phuket (*included in tour price*), located very scenically on the coast, where we will be transferred to our hotel to rest and refresh. Overnight: **Phuket** (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 14: Phang Nga Mangrove Forest (15 Mar) Our first birding destination will be Phang Nga Mangrove Forest, where we will look for Mangrove Pitta, Brownwinged Kingfisher, Ruddy Kingfisher, Collared Kingfisher, Black and Red Broadbill, White-chested Babbler, Asian Glossy Starling, and many the other birds. We will spend one full day in Phang Nga Mangrove Forest and the areas nearby. In the afternoon we head to Khao Lak and check into Kuk Kak Inn. Overnight: Kuk Kak Inn (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B,L,D)

Day 15: Sri Phang Nga NP (16 Mar) A full day spent in Sri Phang Nga, where we will look for Banded Pitta, Blue-banded Kingfisher, Rufous-collared Kingfisher, Banded Kingfisher, Black-backed Kingfisher, Blue-eared Kingfisher, Rufous-winged Philentoma, Asian Paradise Flycatcher, Chestnut-naped Forktail, Green Broadbill, Red-throated Barbet, Blue-eared Barbet, Coppersmith Barbet, Hairy-backed Bulbul, Striated Bulbul, Spectacled Bulbul, Red-eyed Bulbul, Javan Frogmouth, Gould's Frogmouth, Whiskered Treeswift, Grey-throated Babbler, Rufous-winged Babbler, Chestnut-bellied Malkoha, Raffle's Malkoha, Crow-billed Drongo, Red-bearded Bee eater, Great Hornbill, Bushy, Crested Hornbill, White-crowed Hornbill, Helmeted Hornbill, Oriental Pied Hornbill, Wallace's Hawk Eagle, Crested Serpent Eagle, Crested Goshawk, Shikra, Purple-naped Sunbird, Crimson Sunbird, Plain Sunbird, Tiger Shrike, Brown Shrike, Velvet-fronted Nuthatch, Banded Bay Cuckoo and many other great birds. Overnight: Resort in Khao Sok (en-suite hotel room; meals included: B,L,D).

Days 16-17: Khao Luang National Park (17 - 18 Mar) We spend 2 days bird watching in Khao Luang National Park. Here we will target Maroon Woodpecker, Buffnecked Woodpecker, Banded Bay Woodpecker, Black and Buff Woodpecker, Malaysian Rail Babbler, Chestnut-naped Forktail, White-crowned Forktail, Orangeheaded Thrush, Brown-streaked Flycatcher, Tiga Flycatcher, Red-bearded Bee-eater, Asian Paradise Flycatcher, Yellow-breasted, Crimson-breasted Flowerpecker, Thick-billed Flowerpecker, Javan Frogmouth, Brown Wood-owl. Orange-breasted Trogon, Scarlet-rumped Trogon, Fluffy-backed Tit Babbler, Chestnut-winged Babbler, Greenbilled Malkoha, Raffle's Malkoha, Black-bellied Malkoha, Chestnut-breasted Malkoha, Chestnut-bellied Malkoha, Red-billed Malkoha, Wallace's Hawk Eagle, Changeable Hawk Eagle, Plaintive Cuckoo, Gold-whiskered Barbet, Black and Yellow Broadbill, Banded Broadbill, Dusky Broadbill and other Birds. In the afternoon we return to Phuket and check into our hotel for a final dinner and bird checklist and to recap on no doubt a great tour! Overnight: Coriacea Beach Resort, Phuket (en-suite hotel room, meals included: B, L, D).
