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Grey Falcon & Letter-winged Kite 7-day birding tour

30 Sep – 7 October 2025



Grey Falcon and Letter-winged Kite are amongst Australia's most sought-after raptors. During our many outback birding tours we've located these species reliably enough to be able to offer this special tour. We should have multiple sightings of both species. This is a reasonably fast-paced trip deep into the outback, with early departures and late finishes each day, while covering over 2500 km in 6 days. We'll look for many other good outback species as well including Black-breasted Buzzard

Buzzard, Black Falcon, Inland Dotterel, Flock Bronzewing, Australian Pratincole, Kalkadoon & Eyrean Grasswren, Cinnamon Quail-thrush, Gibberbird, Orange and Crimson Chat, Painted Finch, Banded Whiteface, Honeyeaters including Pied and Grey-fronted; and witness spectacular outback desert scenery along with the famous rock formations of the Flinders Ranges. After good rainfalls it's shaping up to be an excellent year for outback birding - don't miss out!

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Tour details

Tour starts: Mount Isa, Queensland **Tour finishes:** Adelaide, South Australia

Scheduled departure and return dates:

Tour commences with dinner on 30 Sep 2025. Please arrive on or before 30 Sep 2025. Tour finishes afternoon of 7 Oct 2025. Please depart on or after 7 Oct 2025 – please don't book domestic flights departing before 17:00 that day. Itinerary contains further details.

Leader: Peter Waanders and/or Michael Greenshields.

Difficulty: ~~Low/Medium/High/Excellent~~ level of fitness required. Tour covers over 2,500 km in 6 days so has a reasonably fast pace. Includes 700 km on bumpy outback dirt roads. Walks are on varying surfaces, from paved roads to uneven, gravelly trails with some short climbs and off-track walking involves stony plains and soft sand dunes. We generally walk slowly, with lots of stops. You can opt out of any challenging walks.

What to bring: Please travel light. Binoculars, camera, mobile phone, chargers, power adaptors if you're an international visitor, insect repellent, sunscreen, personal medications, travel umbrella, hat, water bottle, hand sanitizer. Sturdy footwear recommended. Scopes, super-telephoto lenses with tripods, and heavy suitcases are discouraged.

Clothing: Lightweight long pants, t-shirt and long-sleeved shirt, over the top of which you can wear layers that can be taken off as necessary, including a rain-proof jacket. Neat casual attire for dinners. Shorts and sandals or thongs (flip-flops) are acceptable for non-birding time.

Group size: Minimum 4, maximum 8 participants.

Cost: AU\$5,299 per person including accommodation and all meals, based on double or twin-share occupancy. Single occupancy surcharge of \$660. Not included: drinks, tips, personal expenses. Earlybird discount of \$99 for bookings received up to 12 months before departure date. Return-client discount may apply.

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ITINERARY

Day 0: 30 Sep '25. Make your own way to our hotel (included) in Mt Isa, Qld where we'll meet for introductions and dinner this evening. Overnight Hotel in Mt Isa (private en-suite room; meals included: D).

Day 1: 1 Oct '25. Pick-up from your hotel (own arrangements) in Mt Isa. Travel south, birding for Kalkadoon Grasswren, Painted Finch, Spinifexbird, as the landscape changes from vegetated, grassy hills and woodlands to bare gibber plains. Overnight **Desert Sands Motel, Boulia** (private en-suite rooms; meals included: L, D).

Day 2: 2 Oct '25. Our first chance of breeding or roosting Letter-winged Kites today. Other possibilities include Australian Pratincole, Flock Bronzewing, Spinifex Pigeon and Gibberbird. Overnight in the remote **Birdsville Hotel** (private en-suite motel rooms; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 3: 3 Oct '25. We have good further chances of Letter-winged Kite this morning while we move south in search of our next main target, the enigmatic Grey Falcon. Other species we may encounter here are Pied and Black Honeyeater, Eyrean Grasswren, Gibberbird, Flock Bronzewing & more. Overnight **Mungerannie Pub** (basic, clean rooms with shared facilities; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 4: 4 Oct '25. A big day as we bird the Birdsville track for Banded Whiteface, Cinnamon Quail-thrush, Chirruping Wedgebill, Gibberbird and Rufous Fieldwren. We stand a good chance of finding other sought-after species here such as Orange and Crimson Chat, Black-breasted Buzzard and many more. But of course the main target today is Grey Falcon, of which there are usually one or two breeding pairs each year. Overnight **Mungerannie Pub** (basic, clean rooms with shared facilities; meals included: B, L, D).

Day 5: 5 Oct '25. We depart around sunrise to search for any species still needed. Afterwards we continue deeper into the outback, where the tracks traverse endless open stony plains interspersed with mostly dry watercourses. We look for Black Falcon, Budgerigar, Red-backed Kingfisher, and have a good chance of Inland Dotterel. The sand dunes harbour Eyrean Grasswren. Not far from here an artesian bore-fed wetland usually holds Brolga and a raft of waterbirds, including crakes – in amidst desert-like scenery. We have further chances of Grey Falcons today. **Lyndhurst Hotel** (private en-suite cabins). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 6: 6 Oct '25. After a morning bird walk (chance of Thick-billed Grasswren, Black-breasted Buzzard, Rufous Fieldwren) we head south along the edge of the Flinders Ranges. Possible species along the way including Elegant Parrot, Redthroat, Banded Stilt, Chirruping Wedgebill and others. Overnight **Standpipe Motel, Pt Augusta**(en-suite rooms, meals included: B, L, D).



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Day 7: 7 Oct '25. We'll do some early birding in the Arid Lands Botanical Gardens before heading to Adelaide. Tour finishes mid-afternoon. Please book flights departing no earlier than 15:30. The elusive Slender-billed Thornbill beckons, as do a variety of parrots, honeyeaters and a chance of Black Falcon. Meals incl.: B, L. TOUR ENDS).

Getting there & away:

On day 0 you'll need to make your own way to Mt Isa, Qld (with many daily flights on Qantas, Virgin and Rex from Brisbane) and meet us at our hotel there for dinner and introductions. On the last day you will be dropped off at the airport in Adelaide. It is advisable not to book flights departing before 15:30 that afternoon.

Pre- and post tour options:

This tour links seamlessly with our preceding [Australian Endemic Families](#) tour which ends in Brisbane early afternoon of 30 Sep, from where it is a short late afternoon flight to Mt Isa.

If you wish to stay an extra night before the tour starts or after it finishes, we can book you into a hotel, please indicate this on the booking form.

Price inclusions and exclusions:

Included: All meals commencing with Lunch on Day 1, finishing with Lunch on Day 7, morning tea/coffee, some snacks, some fruit, some drinks, unlimited drinking water refills. Accommodation in private en-suite rooms, although on some nights only basic rooms with shared facilities are available. Transport using comfortable and reliable 4WD vehicle, expert guiding, any entry fees, taxes.

Excluded: Travel to & from departure and finish points, Pre- & post trip accommodation, any meals before Lunch on Day 1, Dinner on Day 7, drinks except where provided, personal expenses, tips, insurance.
