









Bali and East Java

11-20 April 2026

This tour is a great introduction to birding in Indonesia. Safe, comfortable and reliable, this tour covers the well-known yet from a birding point of view under-explored island of Bali and the adjacent eastern part of Java. These two areas boast a wide variety of birds, many of which are endemic to small regions.

Bali and Java contain a rich diversity in habitats within a relatively small area. From coastal lagoons — a haven for waterbirds — to savannah-like grasslands with some unique species. Indonesia boasts some of the bird-richest rainforests on the planet, tropical in the lowlands and temperate rainforest

covering the slopes of long-extinct volcanoes: this tour covers them all.

Most importantly, you will be accompanied by an experienced Australian guide who has birded the Indonesian islands many times and has worked with local people for years. Accompanied by a local guide and dedicated driver, the team will make sure that the tour runs smoothly and that all you need to worry about is enjoying the birds! As an added bonus, the area is rich in history, culture and spectacular wildlife.



Detailed Itinerary

Day 0: 11th April 2026 Arrival in Bali

Fly to Bali, where you will be greeted at the airport by our Bellbird tour leader and transferred to your hotel to rest and refresh. Should you decide to travel earlier, please make your own way to our hotel. We will meet this evening for dinner, introductions and orientation.

Overnight: Tuban, en-suite hotel rooms

Meals included: Dinner

Day 1: 12th April 2026 Southern Bali and Hindu Temple

After an early breakfast we head out for the day to visit a number of habitats around the southern regions of Bali. Here we will find some spectacular birds including Small-blue and Collared Kingfisher, Sunda Teal, Pink-necked Pigeon, Olive-backed Tailorbird and Scarlet-headed Flowerpecker, as well as huge groups of Heron, Egret and Cormorant. We will look for the endemic Javan Plover and enjoy good views of an assortment of waders, waterfowl and watch for raptors and frigatebirds overhead.

We'll also visit an ancient Hindu temple situated high above the ocean to search for the endangered Black-winged Starling, and be treated with ocean views of White-tailed Tropicbirds.

Overnight: Tuban, en-suite hotel rooms Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 2: 13th April 2026 North to Bedugul

Today we'll make an early departure for our drive north through the mountains graced with rice fields, rainforests, lakes and temples. These habitats should yield a diversity of birds including Javan Kingfisher, Javan, Nutmeg and White-capped Munia, Greater Racket-tailed Drongo, Ruddy Cuckoo-dove, White-crowned Forktail and more. Around a lake we should see Cinnamon and Yellow Bittern and Striated Grassbird.

Overnight: Bedugul, en-suite motel rooms Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 3: 14th April 2026 Bedugul Botanic Gardens to Bali Barat

After breakfast and only a short drive we find ourselves at the Bedugul Botanic Gardens. A well laid out and cared for habitat that features more mountain species including Mountain Tailorbird, Javan Grey-throated and Mountain Whiteeye. Also likely are Indonesian Honeyeater, Fulvous-chested Jungle-Flycather, Blood-breasted Flowerpecker, Scarlet Minivet, Ashy Drongo and Grey-headed Canary-Flycather. After lunch we take a scenic drive to the north coast and then west to the Bali Barat (West Bali) region.

Overnight: West Bali, en-suite motel rooms Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 4: 15th April 2026 Bali Barat NP to Java

Today we head to the famous Bali Barat National Park. Only a short drive from our accommodation we find ourselves poised to see one of Indonesia's most endangered species of bird: the Bali Myna. We're also likely to encounter Beach Stone-Curlew, Savannah Nightjar, Black-thighed Falconet, Small Minivet, Blue-eared Kingfisher and various Woodpeckers.

After observing the rare Bali Myna we take a short boat ride to an atoll island for the curious Lemon-bellied White-eye, where we're also likely to see Mangrove Whistler. Back to the mainland for our other major target: the Javan Banded Pitta. En-route we'll look for Rufous-backed Dwarf-Kingfisher, Grey-rumped Treeswift, Orange-breasted Pigeon and Green Junglefowl. Lastly we check tidal flats for Lesser Adjutant, Gull-billed Heron and shorebirds prior to a short ferry ride to Java.

Overnight: Banyuwangi, East Java, en-suite motel rooms

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 5: 16th April 2026 Baluran National Park

After breakfast we head North to Baluran National Park. This is a savannah plain and is as close to African habitat you will find in Asia. Here roams the endangered Banteng ox, Asian Wild Dog and the endangered Green Peafowl.

Baluran is also home to some great raptors such as Crescent Serpent-Eagle and Changeable Hawk-Eagle. Other potentials include Sunda Cuckoo, Chestnut-headed Bee-eater, Greater Flame-back, Greycheeked Tit-babbler, Horsfield's Babbler, Chestnut-breasted Malkoha, Asian Pied Hornbill and the sensational Rhinoceros Hornbill.

Overnight: Banyuwangi, East Java, en-suite motel rooms

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 6: 17th April 2026 Mount Ijen

After an early breakfast and departure we take a 4WD vehicle to the slopes of Gunung (Mount) Ijen. Again this will take us to a completely new habitat with totally different birds. Targets will include Grey-breasted Partridge, Barred Cuckoo-Dove, Flame-fronted Barbet, Sunda Warbler, Lesser Shortwing, Javan Whistling-Thrush, Darkbacked Imperial-Pigeon, Orange-breasted Trogon, Black-banded Barbet, Pied Shrike-Babbler, Orange-spotted Bulbul, Sunda Bush-Warbler, White-flanked Sunbird, Pink-headed Fruit-Dove, Trilling Shrike-Babbler, Blue Whistling-Thrush, Little Pied Flycatcher, Snowybrowed Flycatcher, and Scaly Thrush.

Overnight: Banyuwangi, East Java, en-suite motel rooms

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 7: 18th April 2026 Mangroves and Beaches at Alas Purwo NP

We take a day trip to Alas Purwo NP on the south-eastern tip of Java, made up of mangroves, savanna, lowland monsoon forests, and coral-fringed beaches. Here we may find the endangered Banteng (Ox), Green Peafowl, Red Junglefowl, Beach Thick-knee, Lesser Adjutant, Javan Plover, Javan Hawk-eagle, Orange-breasted Pigeon, Javan Kingfisher, Banded Pitta, Grey-cheeked Tit-babbler, Crescent-chested Babbler, Black-winged Starling and other local specialties.

Overnight: Banyuwangi, East Java, en-suite motel rooms

Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 8: 19th April 2026 Birding on the Way to Kuta

An early morning will find us birding for anything we may have missed or other potential targets. We then head back for a late breakfast and leisurely drive back to Kuta, Bali along the west coast road. En-route we stop off at various locations picking up any species missed and viewing some of the attractions offered along the way.

Overnight: Kuta, Bali, en-suite motel rooms Meals Included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 9: 20th April 2026 Departure from Bali

After breakfast (included) we will say our farewells and escort you to your flight or your hotel of choice (if nearby) should you want to stay on for a while.



GETTING THERE & AWAY

On Day 0 (11 April), you'll need to make your own way (own cost) to Denpasar International Airport where you will be greeted at the airport by our Bellbird tour leader and transferred to your hotel to rest and refresh in time for dinner and introductions that evening. On the last day (Day 9) we wil take you back to the airport after breakfast, or to a hotel of your choice in Denpasar if you prefer to stay on.

PRACTICAL DETAILS

LEADERS

Steve Potter and local guide.

DIFFICULTY

Medium level of fitness required. The tour has a relaxed pace and walks are on mostly flat, but unpaved, surfaces, and include some short climbs. We generally walk slowly, with lots of stops. You can opt out of any walks

ACCOMMODATION

Private en-suite rooms in hotels or lodges. Standards of lodgings are good to very comfortable. Most lodgings offer wi-fi access.

CLOTHING

In the day it will be warm to hot, evenings will be balmy. Lightweight long pants, t-shirt and long-sleeved shirt over the top of which you can wear layers that can be taken off as necessary. Jacket or jumper for the evenings. Neat casual attire for dinners. Sturdy, comfortable footwear for birding. Shorts and sandals or thongs (flip-flops) are acceptable for non-birding time.

WHAT TO BRING

Please travel light. Binoculars, camera, mobile phone, chargers, international power adaptors, insect repellent, sunscreen, personal medications, sun hat, water bottle, hand sanitizer. Scopes, tripods, huge tele-photo lenses, and hard-cased heavy suitcases are discouraged.
