

Grey Falcon & Letter-winged Kite Tour

29 September - 6 October 2027

Grey Falcon and Letter-winged Kite are amongst Australia's most sought-after raptors. During our many outback birding tours we've located these species reliably enough to be able to offer this special tour. We should have multiple sightings of both species. This is a reasonably fast-paced trip deep into the outback, with early departures and late finishes each day, while covering over 2500 km in 6 days. We'll look for other good outback species as well, including Black-breasted Buzzard, Inland Dotterel, Flock Bronzewing, Australian Pratincole, Eyrean Grasswren, Cinnamon

Quail-thrush, Gibberbird, Orange and Crimson Chat, Painted Finch, Banded Whiteface, Honeyeaters including Pied and Grey-fronted; and witness spectacular outback desert scenery along with the famous rock formations of the Flinders Ranges. After good rainfalls it's shaping up to be an excellent year for outback birding—don't miss out!

We offer a 1-day extension for Carpentarian Grasswren at the end.



ITINERARY

Day 0: 29 September 2027 Arrival in Mt Isa

Meet for introductions and dinner at our hotel (included) in Mt Isa, Qld. Overnight Abacus Motel, Mt Isa (private en-suite rooms). Meals incl: D.

Day 1: 30 September 2027 Lake Moondarra, Cloncurry, and Winton

We start the day at Lake Moondarra, where waterbirds such as Glossy Ibis, Green Pygmy-goose, Whistling-ducks, Plumed Egret live along-side terrestrial birds like Painted Finch, Spotted Bowerbird, Red-winged Parrot, Varied Lorikeet, Spinifexbird, Long-tailed Finch and more. This is a true birding paradise; we'll spend most of the morning here, before traveling to Cloncurry for a picnic lunch. The afternoon is spent driving south; along the way we'll stop at the iconic Crocodile Dundee hotel for a look and a laugh. Across the vast grassy plains, we might come across Brolga, Australian Bustard, Black Falcon and Horsfield's Bushlark, until we reach Winton to look for Plum-headed Finch. Overnight Boulder Opal Inn, Winton (private en-suite rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 2: 1 October 2027 Lark Quarry - Opalton

Today we bird the Lark Quarry – Opalton area for Opalton Grasswren, Rufous-crowned Emuwren, Hall's Babbler, Spinifexbird and Chestnut-breasted Quail-thrush. We stand a good chance of finding our first Grey Falcon, plus many other sought-after species such as Crimson Chat, Black-breasted Buzzard and others. We'll take lunch in the Dinosaur Trackways centre, situated high up on a rugged jump-up plateau with spectacular views over the surrounding plains, while Spinifex Pigeons scurry around the undergrowth. There is the option to visit the dinosaur stampede here this afternoon (own cost). Afterwards we continue west across more endless grassy plains, with another chance of Grey Falcon until we reach the small town of Boulia. We check the local watercourse for Red-browed Pardalote, Spotted Bowerbird, Cockatiel, Budgerigar and Red-backed Kingfisher. Overnight Desert Sands Motel, Boulia (private en-suite rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 3: 2 October 2027 Grey Falcons

A big day today as we explore Astrebla Downs and/or Diamantina Lakes NP. These rugged, remote parks are strongholds for Grey Falcon, Letter-winged Kite and many other outback species. It was in this gen-

eral area that the Night Parrot was rediscovered in 2013! Other species we may encounter here are Pied and Black Honeyeater, Inland Dotterel, Gibberbird, Black Falcon and more. Overnight Bedourie Royal Hotel (private en-suite motel rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 4: 3 October 2027 Letter-winged Kites

As we head further south in search of breeding or roosting Letter-winged Kites the landscape changes from bare gibber plains to vegetated, grassy plains and scattered Waddi trees (a rare, ancient acacia species). We hope to see Australian Pratincole, Flock Bronzewing, Spinifex Pigeon and Inland Dotterel. Overnight Birdsville Hotel, Birdsville (private en-suite rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 5: 4 October 2027 More Letter-winged Kites

After a morning bird walk targeting Red-browed Pardalote, the localized race of Red-rumped Parrot, and our last chance of Letter-winged Kite, today will be mostly spent travelling north to reach Boulia early afternoon. Along the way we have further chances of Black Falcon, Australian Pratincole, Gibberbird, Flock Bronzewing, Inland Dotterel, Crimson and Orange Chats and Australian Bustard. Overnight: Desert Sands Motel, Boulia (en-suite motel rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 6: 5 October 2027 To Mt Isa and Lake Moondarra

An early start will see us visit local waterholes to witness Budgerigars and/or Flock Bronzewings coming in to drink. Along the way north, back to Mt Isa, we search for the elusive Kalkadoon Grasswren, Banded Whiteface and Spinifexbird, and we have a good chance of increasing the number of species of finches and parrots we've seen. Overnight: Abacus Motel, Mt Isa (en-suite motel rooms). Meals included: B, L, D.

Day 7: 6 October 2027 Departure from Mt Isa or one-day extension

After breakfast (incl.) departure from Mt Isa. Taxi to airport (own cost).

Or join our 1 day extension to the spinifex habitats west of Mt Isa, in search of Carpentarian Grasswren, Black-tailed Treecreeper and many other good species. The extension includes breakfast, lunch, dinner and an extra night's accommodation tonight, so you can depart tomorrow (29 Sep). Price for the extension is AU\$600 pp (min. 3).

PRACTICAL DETAILS

LEADERS

Expert Bellbird tour leader.

DIFFICULTY

Medium level of fitness required. The tour has a reasonably fast pace and walks are on varying surfaces, from paved roads to uneven, gravelly trails with some short climbs and soft sandy dunes. We generally walk slowly, with lots of stops. You can opt out of any challenging walks.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation in private en-suite rooms, although on some nights only cabins or basic rooms with shared facilities are available. See itinerary for details.. Due to the remote nature of this trip, we may not have phone reception or wi-fi access every day.

CLOTHING

Lightweight long pants, t-shirt and long-sleeved shirt, over the top of which you can wear layers that can be taken off as necessary, including a rain-proof jacket. Neat casual attire for dinners. Sturdy footwear recommended. Gaiters may be useful to protect your ankles from prickly vegetation. Shorts and sandals or thongs (flip-flops) are acceptable for non-birding time.

WHAT TO BRING

Please travel light. Binoculars, camera, mobile phone, chargers, power adaptors if you're an international visitor, insect repellent, sunscreen, personal medications, travel umbrella, sun hat, water bottle, hand sanitizer. Sturdy footwear recommended. Scopes, super-telephoto lenses, tripods, and heavy hard-shell suitcases are discouraged.
