

Mount Isa Short & Wet Tour

11 - 14 January 2028

The area around Mount Isa is where the outback meets the sub-tropics, resulting in a great variety of sought-after birds, not in the least two unique species of Grasswrens: Kalkadoon and Carpentarian. During the wet season a range of unusual species pass through here: chance of Oriental Plover, Oriental Pratincole, Yellow Chat and Little Curlew. During this long weekend of birding we aim to see, besides the mentioned species, Spinifexbird, Spinifex Pigeon, Painted Finch, Pictorella Mannikin, Chestnut-breasted Munia, Grey-headed Honeyeater, Cloncurry Ringneck, Little Woodswallow, Black-tailed Treecreeper, Varied Lorikeet, Paper-

bark Flycatcher, Spotted Bowerbird and many more. Creeks and other waterbodies will provide chances of Plumed Whistling Ducks, Comb-crested Jacana, Green Pygmy Goose and other waterfowl, as well as Purple-necked Rock-wallaby and Freshwater Crocodile and we even have a chance of the enigmatic Grey Falcon. We'll stay in the same accommodation throughout the trip so we can take daily drives out to the various birding locations. We have secured access to some new birding sites exclusively for this trip. The rewards will be some sought-after species, wonderful scenery and great camaraderie. Space is limited.

ITINERARY

Day 1: 11 January 2028

Arrival at Mount Isa

Make your own way to Mount Isa (Queensland), serviced by direct flights on Qantas, Virgin and Rex from Brisbane. Arrive mid-morning and we'll pick you up from the airport and head into town for lunch and introductions. We'll check into our hotel and head off birding to the sewage ponds and surrounding rambling bird-rich horse paddocks. In the late afternoon we'll have our first chance at Kalkadoon Grasswren not far from town

Day 2: 12 January 2028

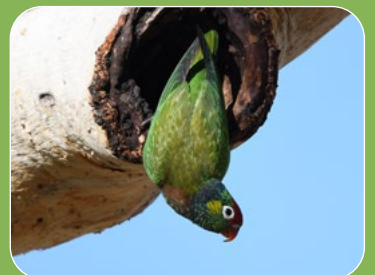
Kalkadoon and Carpentarian Grasswren

We have a full day around Mount Isa, where we'll be searching for two Grasswren species: Kalkadoon and Carpentarian. Another drawcard here is Painted Finch, of which we've seen flocks of over a hundred on prior visits. We'll also spend time looking for other good species of the local area, including Spinifex Pigeon, Little Woodswallow, the 'Cloncurry' race of Australian Ringneck, Spinifexbird and Grey-headed Honeyeater, Black-tailed Treecreeper, Varied Lorikeet, Little Buttonquail and many more. We'll also visit the sewage ponds, with chance of Plumed Whistling Ducks and other waterfowl.

Nearby at Lake Moondarra we have a chance of any or all of Oriental Plover, Oriental Pratincole, Yellow Chat, Pictorella Mannikin and Little Curlew. We'll also look for Paperbark Flycatcher, Spotted Bowerbird, Plumed Whistling Duck, Painted Finch, Purple-necked Rock-wallaby and Freshwater Crocodile.

The morning will be spent re-visiting sites of great interest from yesterday, and/or picking up any species we may have missed. After a leisurely lunch we visit Lake Moondarra again for further chances of the above-mentioned species. One of these days we may also go out at night, for those who like to have a chance of Spotted Nightjar.

PRACTICAL DETAILS

LEADERS

Experienced Bellbird tour leader.

DIFFICULTY

Medium level of fitness required. This trip is slow paced. Walking in uneven terrain will still be required to find some of the birds, but we have secured access to some new and exclusive (and easier) sites. There will be some early departures or late finishes. We can't control the weather and during the wet season it doesn't rain as much as you might think, but it will be warm to hot and a bit humid. Expect thunderstorms in the afternoon while we take a break.

ACCOMMODATION

Private, comfortable en-suite motel rooms.

CLOTHING

Lightweight long pants, t-shirt and long-sleeved shirt, over the top of which you can wear layers that can be taken off as necessary, including a rain-proof jacket. Neat casual attire for dinners. Be prepared for the odd rain shower. Sturdy footwear recommended.

WHAT TO BRING

Please travel light. Binoculars, camera, mobile phone, chargers, power adaptors if you're an international guest, insect repellent, sunscreen, personal medications, sun hat, water bottle, hand sanitizer. Scopes, super-telephoto lenses with tripods, and very large heavy suitcases discouraged, but please contact us to discuss.
